High Priority: Child Learning Disability

Prioritising high standards in challenging settings – psychiatry for CAMHS professionals

Increasingly, children who have a learning disability are being seen in mainstream CAMHS. Professionals may be used to seeing young people with a mild impairment but many are wary of seeing those who have a more severe level of disability.

This course will introduce you to the more commonly seen psychiatric, emotional and behavioural issues presenting in this population and demonstrate how to assess and manage them. Although delivered by a psychiatrist, the course will discuss the vital roles of nurses, clinical psychology, speech and language therapy and occupational therapy in the multi-disciplinary team (MDT). Participants should leave feeling much happier and more confident about seeing children with all levels of intellectual disability.

Learning objectives:

- Understand how children with a learning disability present to services
- Appreciate the family issues for parents and siblings
- Learn how the school setting can support or cause problems for the young person
- Know the importance of ASD and ADHD as co-morbid conditions
- Understand how psychiatric illness can present in this patient group
- Appreciate the role of professionals in the MDT
- Know the treatment strategies including the role of medication

Brief Outline:

- Welcome and introduction to learning disability. Common causes and genetic syndromes
- Family issues
- Communication, behavioural and sensory issues. Interface with other professionals and multi-agency working
- Treatment including evidence based treatments. Mental capacity and best interest decisions
- Case vignettes and group working
- Questions, discussion and course evaluation

Who should attend?

This course is suitable for all CAMHS Professionals who will be or are seeing children who have an intellectual disability.

About our trainer, Pru Allington-Smith:

Expert, Pru Allington-Smith is a dually trained psychiatrist (Child Psychiatry and Learning Disability Psychiatry) who has been working in this field for over twenty years. In her NHS consultant post she was involved in looking after a large city catchment area as well as working in a specialist inpatient unit caring for adolescents with a learning disability and complex psychiatric problems. Pru now works part time in the private sector looking after highly complex children in care settings and teaching. She is passionate about her work and continues to be active nationally representing the needs of this patient group and currently sits on the Learning Disability Senate.

This training course is interactive and utilises a wide variety of teaching methods. Pru draws heavily on her experience within the lectures, scenarios and discussion.
